It works across a spectrum of scales, from huge new-builds or remodels to smaller commissions, and clever use of glazing - and lots of it – is one thing that binds together its oeuvre. If you are in the market for a sensitive conversion, take a look at Weal Architects. Working out of two rural bases, the practice is considered to be an expert in restoration. with director Francesca Weal recognised by the RIBA as a specialist conservation architect. JOHN PARDEY

Fans of Modernism will love John Pardey's design aesthetic with its celebration of clean, simple lines. Almost without exception, the practice's elegant structures make use of natural materials and there's an emphasis on bringing together indoor and outdoor spaces. 'We aim at a timeless quality in our designs, and avoid the fashionable at all costs,' says Pardey.
